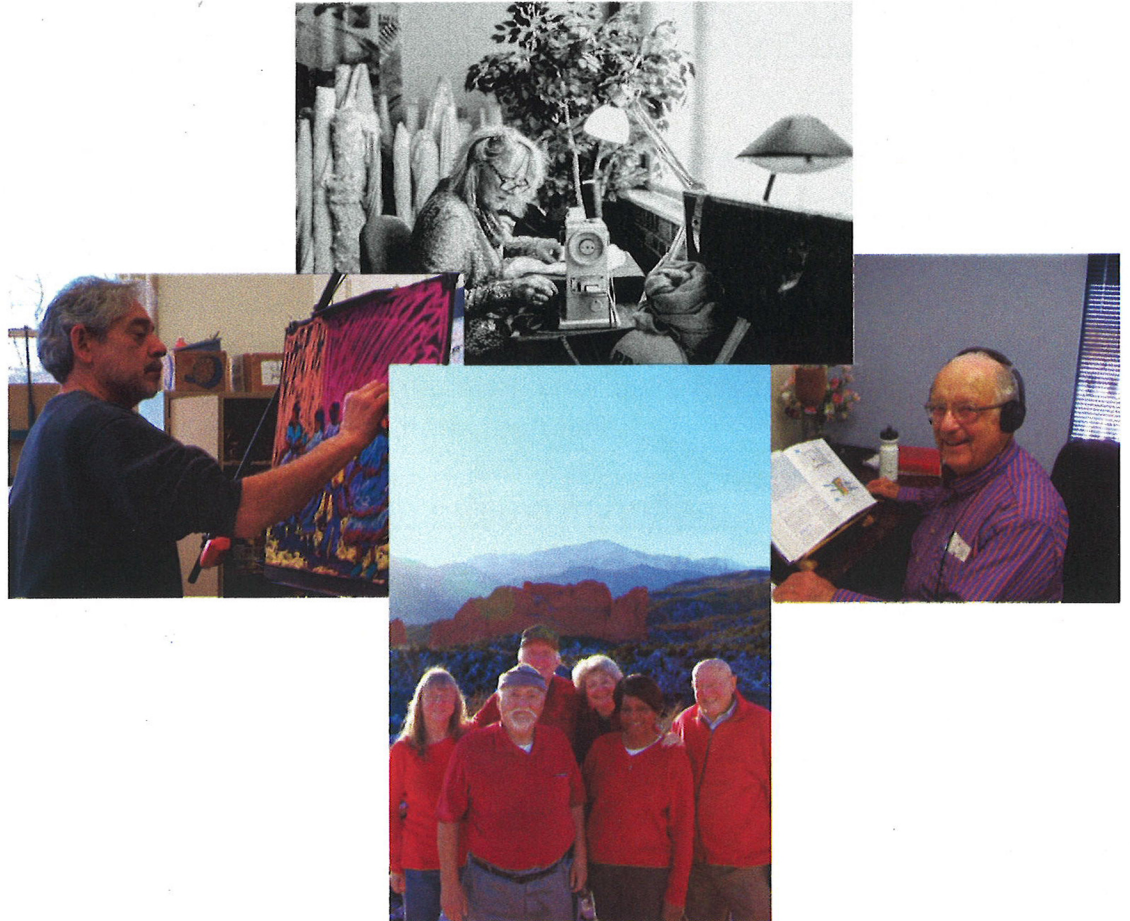

Disaster Preparation

To plan for a major disaster, assume you would be without power and would not be able to go out for food or water. Your “stay at home” household emergency supplies should include:

- Enough water to last three to six days (recommended: one gallon per person per day)
- Enough food to last three to six days (nonperishable items that don't require cooking)
- Flashlight
- Portable radio with spare batteries
- First aid kit
- Hand-operated can opener
- Waterproof matches
- A three to six-day supply of prescription medications and a current list of your medications
- Cell phone, if you have one
- Cash or traveler's checks
- Names and phone numbers you would want to have or give to others in an emergency

Your “evacuation bag” should be packed with the following:

- Basic hygiene items like toilet paper, alcohol wipes, and hand sanitizer
- Extra pair of prescription glasses
- Change of clothing
- Compact rain slicker

- Good pair of walking shoes
- Blanket or sleeping bag
- Energy bars, one or two bottles of water, some hard candy
- Disposable dust masks
- Copies of your emergency names and phone numbers and your medication list

Five programs available:

- **1) Defensible Space Assistance for Income-Eligible (DSAFIE)**
Helps low-income seniors and persons with physical disabilities adhere to defensible space regulations, which are designed to

protect homes and lives in wildfire-prone areas.

DSAFIE services may include:

- Brush and tree trimming/thinning.
- Roof and gutter cleaning.
- Raking of dead leaves and pine needles.
- Chipping of removed vegetation. (Unless agreed on prior to the work chips are usually left onsite.)
- Work performed by insured contractors.

Eligibility Requirements:

- You must be 65 years or older or must be unable to complete this work due to physical disability.
- You must be Financially unable to hire a contractor.
- You must be the legal owner of the property to be cleared, or be the party legally responsible for landscape maintenance.
- You will need to sign a Landowner Access Agreement giving permission for our crew to enter and work on your property.
- One- Person household income: less than 39,150 (annually).
- Two- Person household income: less than 59,128 (annually).
- Three- Person household income: less than 88,692 (annually).
- Four- Person household income: less than 118,256 (annually).

- **2) Community Chipper Program**

This program requires multiple residents in an area to organize a chipper day. A chipper day is when neighbors do defensible space and/or roadside clearing projects, making defined chipper piles, and schedule a day with MCFSC for a chipper crew to chip the limbs and brush. Please see web site for additional information and chipper pile guidelines.

- **3) Reflective Address Signs**

Firefighters and other first responders need to be able to find you in an emergency—even under smoky conditions. California code requires addresses be marked by REFLECTIVE SIGNS, clearly visible from both directions on the roadway. To make Mendocino County better prepared for wildfires and other emergencies, the Mendocino County Fire Safe Council has initiated a “Reflect to Protect” program. For \$20, you can obtain a custom, two-sided, green-and-white address sign for your home. NOTE: SIGNS MUST BE PICKED UP IN UKIAH. WE DO NOT MAIL THEM.

- **4) Help Starting a Neighborhood Fire Safe Council (NFSC)**

Neighborhood Fire Safe Councils (NFSCs) are a foundation for fire preparedness in our communities, and one of the primary goals of the Mendocino County Fire Safe Council is to encourage every neighborhood in the county to develop their own. All you need to do to start your neighborhood group is to fill in the

Neighborhood Fire Safe Council Information.

- **5) Wildfire Risk Home Assessments and Education**

For a limited amount of time we are offering free community event home assessments for three to four homes in an area on the same day.

Representatives MCFSC will walk around the outside of your home and give nonregulatory education on the basics of hardening your home against wildfire, the most important steps to take to lower your risk and share their observations on which improvements to make and how to prioritize them. Emergency Response Systems

Advance Health Care Directive

An advance health care directive is a legal document in which a person specifies what actions should be taken for their health if they are no longer able to make decisions for themselves because of illness or incapacity. A trusted person should be appointed who will make certain these wishes are carried out. Every adult should have an advance directive which explains the type of health care wanted or not wanted at a time when decisions cannot be made by the individual. Widow/Widower Checklist

- Gather together important documents such as your spouse's social security number, death certificate (you will need copies which you can obtain from your funeral director) and any related estate forms (wills, trusts, etc.)
- Contact Medicare and other health insurance providers, (i.e. Medicare Supplement Insurance, Medicare Advantage Plan, Medicare Prescription Drug Plans) to cancel the policy to stop premiums.
- Get statements and pay bills and taxes owed as soon as possible.
- Transfer automobile title into your name and change name on automobile insurance policy. Ask about reduction in premium.
- If your spouse received social security, notify Social Security of the death since these benefits must stop. Ask about your eligibility for survivors or other benefits and any adjustments to your social security check, if applicable.
- Contact credit and merchant card companies to cancel or change account name. Check on credit life insurance that may have been carried on debts and may be covered by insurance.
- Notify spouse's employer and check on benefits which may be due you.
- Transfer real estate title of jointly held property. This does not always require probate. If needed, contact attorney within 30 days following death.
- If your spouse was a Veteran, check with the Veteran's Administration; you may be eligible for help with funeral, burial plat, or other benefits.
- Check with fraternal and other organizations (professional associations, health clubs, automobile clubs, etc.). Benefits may be due to you.
- Notify banks, credit unions, mortgage company, and pension providers.
- Draw up or update your own will. Check with your funeral director to see if he/she can assist you with any of the above items.
- Check for benefits as some accounts provide life insurance/death benefits.
- Change beneficiary on your life insurance.

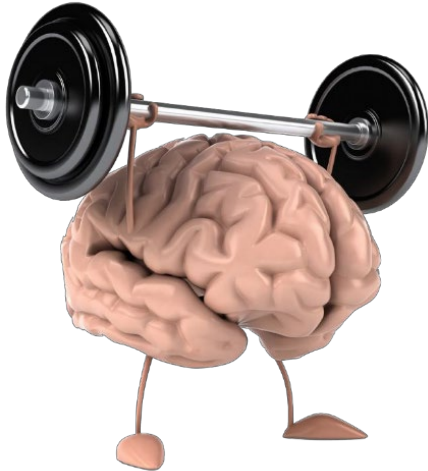
